

## What is participatory budgeting?

A democratic process in which the community members directly decide through voting how to spend \$100,000 of the 2012-2013 Fiscal Year discretionary funding for District 3.

### Project Criteria

- +Provides public benefits to District 3 Residents
- +Project must not exceed \$20,000
- +No more than \$20,000 funded for individual neighbrhood projects
- +Must not be for operational costs
- +Must be implementable by a city department
- +Must be a one-time expenditure
- +Funding must be disbursed by April 1.

### How does participatory budgeting work?

Since January 2013, District 3 community members have come together to discuss community needs and potential projects to meet these needs. The community crowdsourced ideas from one another and brainstormed a diverse area of ideas on Parks, Public Safety, Streets Education, Housing, and Jobs of District 3. These ideas were screened by the Office of the Controller and City Departments. This ballot consists of feasible projects that were selected by community members of which you will be able to vote on today.

#### Voting Instructions

- +Check up to 5 projects.
- +Do not check a project more than once
- +No need to add costs of project to equal \$100,000.

#### Who can vote?

- +Any resident of District 3
- +Age 16 and up regardless of citizenship
