# 160361 [Administrative Code - Appraisals for the Acquisition, Conveyance, and Lease of Real Property]

#### Sponsors: Peskin; Campos

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to require appraisals and appraisal reviews for certain City acquisitions, conveyances, and leases of real property; requiring that appraisals conform to the Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice and be prepared by qualified appraisers; and increasing the rent limits for the Director of Property's existing authority to enter into leases for the City. SUBSTITUTED AND ASSIGNED to Government Audit and Oversight Committee.

## 160422 [Fire, Housing, Building Codes - Fire Safety Requirements for Existing Buildings]

## Sponsors: Campos; Kim, Yee, Tang, Breed and Wiener

Ordinance amending the Fire Code and the Housing Code to require building owners provide tenants with an annual written notice of smoke alarm requirements and require building owners file a statement of compliance with annual fire alarm testing and inspection requirements every two years; amending the Fire Code and Building Code to require building owners to upgrade existing fire alarm systems by July 1, 2021, or upon completion of \$50,000 or more of construction work, whichever occurs earlier; amending the Building Code to require owners of Apartment Houses damaged by fire to submit an Action Plan to the City within 30 days of the fire and requiring owners of buildings in Group R occupancies with six or more units to install fire blocks in open accessible attics when performing \$50,000 or more of construction work; affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act; making findings under the California Health and Safety Code; and directing the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors to forward this ordinance to the California Building Standards Commission upon final passage as required by State law. ASSIGNED UNDER 30 DAY RULE to Public Safety and Neighborhood Services Committee.

# 160423 [Administrative Code - Short-Term Residential Rentals and Hosting Platforms]

Sponsors: Campos; Peskin, Avalos and Mar

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to revise the Residential Unit Conversion Ordinance to require Hosting Platforms verify that a Residential Unit is on the City Registry prior to listing; require Hosting Platforms respond to notices and requests for information; provide for civil, administrative, and criminal penalties against Hosting Platforms for violations of the Residential Unit Conversion Ordinance; and affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act. ASSIGNED UNDER 30 DAY RULE to Land Use and Transportation Committee.

## 160424 [Planning Code, Zoning Map - Sign Regulations]

#### Sponsor: Peskin

Ordinance amending the Planning Code to correct and update provisions, delete obsolete or redundant sections, and reinstate the distinction between Historic and Vintage Signs; amending the Zoning Map to delete the Showplace Square Special Sign District, the South of Market General Advertising Special Sign District, and the Hamm's Building Historic Special Sign District; affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act; and making findings of consistency with the General Plan, and the eight priority policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1, and findings of public convenience, necessity, and welfare under Planning Code, Section 302. ASSIGNED UNDER 30 DAY RULE to Land Use and Transportation Committee.

## 160425 [Administrative Code - Ban on City-Funded Travel to and City Contracts Involving States With Anti-LGBT Laws]

#### Sponsors: Wiener; Campos and Farrell

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to prohibit City-funded travel to states that have enacted laws after June 26, 2015, reversing anti-discrimination protections for LGBT individuals or permitting discrimination against LGBT individuals, and to prohibit City contracting with companies headquartered in states that have enacted such laws, or where work on the contract would be performed in such states. ASSIGNED UNDER 30 DAY RULE to Government Audit and Oversight Committee.

#### 160426 [Planning Code, Zoning Map - Rezoning Midtown Terrace Neighborhood] Sponsor: Yee

Ordinance amending the Planning Code by revising the Zoning Map to rezone all lot numbers in Assessor's Parcel Block Nos. 2643B, 2780, 2781, 2782, 2783, 2784, 2785, 2786, 2787, 2788, 2789, 2790, 2791, 2792, 2793, 2794, 2795, 2796, 2797, 2798, 2820, 2821, 2822, 2822A, 2822B, 2823, 2823A, 2823B, 2823C, 2824, 2825, 2833, 2834, 2835, 2836, from their current designation as Residential, House District: One-Family (RH-1) to Residential, House: One-Family (Detached Dwellings) (RH-1(D)); affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act; and making findings, including findings of public necessity, convenience, and welfare under Planning Code, Section 302, and findings of consistency with the General Plan, and the eight priority policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1. ASSIGNED UNDER 30 DAY RULE to Land Use and Transportation Committee.

# 160427 [Replacement Credit Facilities - Tax Exempt and Taxable Lease Revenue Commercial Paper Certificates of Participation - To Fund Board-Approved Capital Projects - Not to Exceed \$250,000,000]

#### Sponsor: Mayor

Resolution re-authorizing the issuance of Tax-Exempt (Series 1 and Series 2) and Taxable Lease Revenue Commercial Paper Certificates of Participation (Series 1-T and Series 2-T), in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$250,000,000 to finance the acquisition, construction, and rehabilitation of capital improvements and capital equipment approved by the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor; authorizing the replacement of the existing credit facilities in the amount of \$150,000,000; and approving and authorizing execution of a first supplement to trust agreement, a first amendment to site lease, a first amendment to sublease, revolving credit agreements, fee agreements, dealer agreements, and certain other related financing documents, and authorizing other related actions. RECEIVED AND ASSIGNED to Budget and Finance Committee.

## 160428 [Real Property Lease - Opera Plaza, L.P. - 601 Van Ness Avenue - \$363,132 Rent in Initial Year]

#### Sponsor: Breed

Resolution authorizing a Lease between the City and County of San Francisco, as Tenant, and Opera Plaza, L.P., as Landlord, of office space located at 601 Van Ness Avenue in San Francisco, consisting of approximately 8,646 rentable square feet, for an initial term of five years to commence following Board approval, for use by the Human Services Agency of San Francisco at \$30,261 monthly rent, totaling \$363,132 in the initial year, with annual 3% increases and one five-year option to extend the term; and finding the proposed transaction is in conformance with the General Plan, and the eight priority policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1. RECEIVED AND ASSIGNED to Budget and Finance Sub-Committee.

#### 160429 [Urging Training and Promotion of the Right to Breastfeed in Public]

#### **Sponsors:** Campos; Cohen, Mar, Avalos and Yee

Resolution urging the Human Services Agency and San Francisco Police Department to train city employees and contractors on the rights of women to breastfeed in public and urging any city department with a public waiting room to post a sign welcoming breastfeeding in public waiting areas. # 160430 [Central Market Community Benefit District - Annual Reports to the City -Calendar Year 2014]

Resolution receiving and approving annual reports for the Central Market Community Benefit District for calendar year 2014, submitted as required by the Property and Business Improvement District Law of 1994 (California Streets and Highways Code, Sections 36600, et seq.), Section 36650, and the District's management agreement with the City, Section 3.4. ### 160431 [Commemorative Street Name Designation - "Gene Compton's Cafeteria Way" -100 Block of Taylor Street]

Resolution approving the addition of the commemorative street name "Gene Compton's Cafeteria Way" to the 100 Block of Taylor Street in recognition of the Fiftieth Anniversary of the turning point for the civil rights movement for Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, Questioning, and Intersex people, and in specific the contributions of Transgender Women. # 160432 [Approval of a 150-Day Extension for Planning Commission Review of Inclusionary Affordable Housing Program (File No. 150911)]

## Sponsors: Mayor; Farrell and Tang

Resolution extending by 150 days the prescribed time within which the Planning Commission may render its decision on an Ordinance (File No. 150911) amending the Planning Code to provide revised geographic, timing, pricing, and other requirements for the off-site alternative to the Inclusionary Housing Fee; create a new option for off-site projects that qualify as Nonprofit Provider Partner Projects; create a new alternative for project sponsors of smaller market-rate projects to direct the Affordable Housing Fee to small sites projects; create an option for project sponsors of on- and off-site housing to provide higher amounts of affordable housing at higher levels of affordability termed "dialing up;" revise certain definitions and operating procedures related to the Inclusionary Housing Program and make conforming changes; and affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act, and making findings of consistency with the General Plan, and the eight priority policies of the Planning Code, Section 101.1.
