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Resolution authorizing local support for the Department of Public Works Bridge

Preventive Maintenance Program and authorizing the Director of Public Works or his or

her designee to execute all documents pertaining to the project with Caltrans.

[Resolution of Local Support for the Bridge Preventive Maintenance Program.]

WHEREAS, The Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act:

A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA) (Public Law 109-59, August 10, 2005) authorized Federal

Bridge Program funds to be used for preventive maintenance activities on any non-toll public highway bridge with a span greater than 20 feet; and,

WHEREAS, The purpose of the Bridge Preventive Maintenance Program is to help local agencies extend the service lives of their bridges by providing federal funds to perform certain activities that have been pre-approved by the Federal Highway Administration; and,

WHEREAS, The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) administers the Bridge Preventive Maintenance Program (BPMP) and programmed federal funds to help local agencies develop and implement a Bridge Preventive Maintenance Plan, hereafter known as "the Plan"; and,

WHEREAS, DPW is eligible to receive Federal and/or State transportation funding through Caltrans; and,

WHEREAS, In 2006, DPW was awarded \$75,181 in federal funds to develop the Plan proposal; and,

WHEREAS, The DPW Plan proposal included a list of 29 bridges owned and maintained by the City and County of San Francisco; and,

WHEREAS, Caltrans reviewed the Plan and found that 18 of the 29 proposed bridges were eligible for federal funding; and,

WHEREAS, Caltrans has programmed a total of \$7,071,400 for design and construction; and,

WHEREAS, The federal funds will cover 88.53 percent, or \$6,260,310 of the eligible cost as defined by the Federal Highway Administration and administered by Caltrans; and,

WHEREAS, The non-federal share of funds must cover 11.47 percent, or \$811,090 of eligible costs; and,

WHEREAS, In FY 2009-10 Caltrans authorized DPW to proceed with the design phase of work on all 18 eligible bridges, which is estimated to cost \$425,347; and,

WHEREAS, The federal share of \$376,560 (88.53 percent) and non-federal share of \$48,787 (11.47 percent) were appropriated by the Board of Supervisors in the FY 2009-10 Annual Appropriations Ordinance, File 090779; and,

WHEREAS, The DPW anticipates proceeding with the construction phase for seven of the bridges in FY 2009-10; five of the bridges in FY 2010-11; and the remaining six bridges in FY 2011-12; and,

WHEREAS, Caltrans requires a separate resolution adopted by the Board of Supervisors providing their support for the project; and,

WHEREAS, Various agreements need to be executed with Caltrans before federal and/or state funds can be claimed; and,

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco wishes to delegate authorization to execute these agreements and any amendments thereto to the Director of Public Works or his or her designee; now, therefore be it,

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors authorizes local support of the DPW Bridge Preventive Maintenance Program; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Public Works is authorized to execute all documents pertaining to the project with Caltrans.

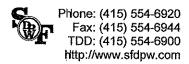

Bridge Preventive Maintenance Program

Summary

The Department of Public Works (DPW) received a federal grant to perform preventive maintenance on 18 eligible bridges within the City and County of San Francisco. The federal funds were approved by the Board of Supervisors in the FY 2009-10 Annual Appropriations Ordinance, file 090779. DPW requests that the Board of Supervisors authorize local support for DPW's Bridge Preventive Maintenance Program (BPMP) projects, which will allow DPW to execute the grant agreement with Caltrans.

Background

A January 11, 2002 FHWA memo announced that Highway Bridge Program (HBP) funds were available to local jurisdictions for preventive maintenance activities on Federal-aid highway bridges (other than bridges on roads classified as local roads or rural minor collectors). In August 2005, the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) was passed by Congress and signed into law by the President. SAFETEA-LU extended reimbursable bridge preventive maintenance activities to include bridges off the federal aid system (urban and rural local streets and roads and rural minor collectors). Effectively, this means all non-toll public highway bridges with spans greater than 20 feet and toll bridges meeting requirements of 23USC144(1) now eligible to receive HBP funding for preventive maintenance activities.

Project Selection

In 2006, DPW applied for and received \$75,181 in federal funds to develop a plan for our BPMP. An accept-expend resolution for these funds was approved by the Board on September 12, 2006, file 061221. The proposal developed by DPW included 29 bridges thought to be eligible for the program. DPW worked within a set of criteria provided by Caltrans to select eligible bridges, including:

- vehicular bridges
- bridge spans greater than 20 feet
- owned by local agencies
- fair to good condition with sufficiency ratings greater than 80 that do not require rehabilitation or replacement

Caltrans reviewed the plan and determined that 18 of the 29 bridges were eligible for federal funding and programmed \$7,071,400 for the design and construction of the eligible bridges. The federal share of the project is 88.53 percent, or \$6,260,310, while DPW must secure an 11.47 percent local match totaling \$811,090.

In July 2009, Caltrans authorized DPW to proceed with preliminary engineering and design of all 18 bridges at a cost of \$425,347. The federal share of \$376,560 was appropriated by the Board of Supervisors in the FY 2009-10 AAO. The local matching portion was secured through Capital Improvement Program and was also appropriated in the FY 2009-10 AAO.

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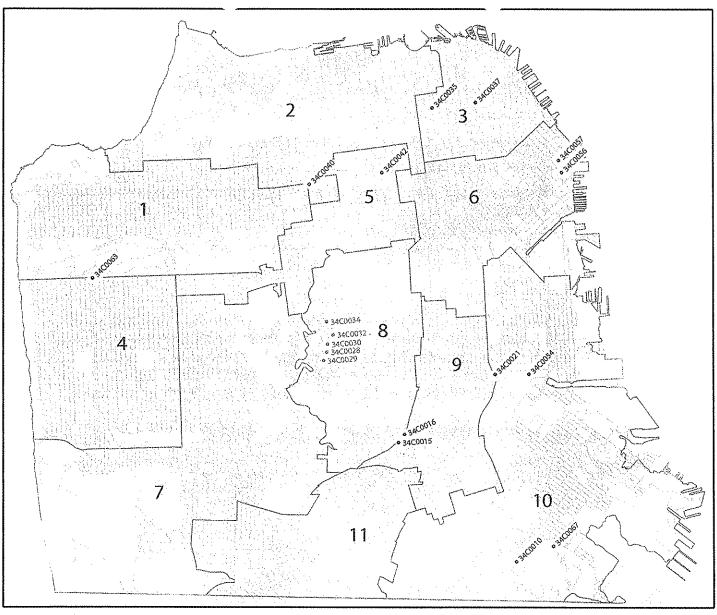
