Resolution supporting Fiscal Year 2010-2011 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Action Plan Goals.

WHEREAS, Under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, and related federal regulations, the City and County of San Francisco is eligible to apply for and receive Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD); and,

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco anticipates receiving approximately \$21,000,000 in CDBG Program Funds from HUD in 2010-2011; and,

WHEREAS, On behalf of the City and County of San Francisco, the Mayor's Office of Housing (MOH) is preparing to release a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the 2010-2011 CDBG Program; and,

WHEREAS, The RFP is in concert with San Francisco's 2005-2009 Consolidated Plan and the current planning process for the 2010-2014 Consolidated Plan; and,

WHEREAS, The current Consolidated Plan was approved by HUD in 2005, and the Mayor's Office of Housing is in the process of updating the plan for 2010-2014; and,

WHEREAS. The planning process for updating the Consolidated Plan details the goals for the CDBG Program: 1) Promote economic self-sufficiency for low- and moderate-income families; 2) Strengthen neighborhood vitality; 3) Increase the provision of timely, relevant and effective social services; 4) Implement culturally and linguistically relevant funding strategies; 5) Promote equity-based public policy strategies; and 6) End widespread chronic homelessness in San Francisco; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors continues to support the CDBG Consolidated Plan goals, and the related 2010-2011 Request for Proposals to achieve these goals.
