[Resolution mandating Police Crisis Intervention Training and Semiannual Reporting]

Resolution urging the Police Commission and the San Francisco Police Department (SFPD to mandate a Police Crisis Intervention training for San Francisco Police Department Officers, and requiring semiannual reporting, beginning in June of 2002, regarding the status and success of the training.

WHEREAS, San Francisco has the highest 5150 rate in the state. 5150's are incidents of people being involuntarily detained for 72 hours for psychiatric evaluation (Bill McConnell, Division of Mental Health, 1996); and,

WHEREAS, Stated by the MacArthur Risk Assessment in August 1999, individuals with mental illnesses are more likely to be victims of violence, rather than perpetrators; and

WHEREAS, One in four calls to the San Francisco Police Department are in response to individuals in psychiatric crisis, or individuals "acting with bizarre behavior" ("Dr. Forrest Fulton" San Francisco Police Department, 1999); and,

WHEREAS, There is an existing effective curriculum for this training, but there is not sufficient funding to provide the training as frequently as is necessary to train an adequate number of officers; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the Police Commission and the San Francisco Police Department to make sure that in two years, 25% of First Responders of the San Francisco Police Officers per shift, per station complete this training; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That within one year at least 12-13% of First Responders per shift, per station must have completed this training; including those who have supervising authority when responding to an individual with a psychiatric crisis; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That this training is maintained at current quality levels until such time all police officers are trained; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That in June of 2002, and every six months thereafter, the Police Department shall report to a Committee of the Board regarding the status and success of the Police Crisis Intervention Training for Police Officers.
