Resolution commending Senator Dianne Feinstein for introducing legislation to amend the Aviation Security Bill to allow lawful permanent residents who are eligible to become U.S. citizens within one year to remain in their current positions.

WHEREAS, The Federal Aviation Security Bill requires that all airport security screeners be U.S. citizens; and,

WHEREAS, Approximately eighty percent of all airport security screeners at San Francisco International Airport are foreign nationals; and,

WHEREAS, Eighty percent of the airport security screeners at San Francisco International Airport will not be able to keep their job when the Aviation Security Bill is implemented; and,

WHEREAS, Thousands of legal immigrants now work as airport screeners and have already applied for naturalization, and would otherwise be unfairly deprived of employment and of their continuing contribution to the US economy and to US security; and

WHEREAS, Adequate transition measures can and should be put into place so that these well-qualified, loyal, and hard-working lawful permanent residents can maintain their gainful employment; and,

WHEREAS, On December 10, 2001 the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco unanimously adopted a resolution urging the San Francisco and California Congressional delegations to amend the Aviation Security Bill to allow non-citizen airport security screeners to retain their jobs regardless of citizenship status; and,

WHEREAS, An "Expedited Naturalization and Continued Employment for Airport Security Screeners Act" has been introduced by Senator Dianne Feinstein to speed the

1	naturalization process and authorize transitional employment for deserving airport security
2	screeners; and,
3	WHEREAS, The passing of this Act will assist in ensuring both the security of our air
4	tranportation system, and the continued employment of loyal residents seeking to become
5	naturalized US citizens; now, therefore, be it
6	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
7	commend Senator Dianne Feinstein for introducing legislation to amend the Aviation Security
