[Enforcement of 1992 Energy Policy Act.]

Resolution urging the United States Department of Energy to enforce the 1992 Energy Policy Act and to remove any loophole that would violate the goal of reducing gasoline consumption.

WHEREAS, In 1992, President Bush passed the Energy Policy Act, requiring federal agencies to purchase vehicles that operate on alternative fuels in order to reduce gasoline consumption; and,

WHEREAS the Sierra Club, the Center for Biological Diversity, and the Bluewater Network have filed suit in San Francisco federal court, citing non-compliance by the U.S. Department of Energy and 17 other federal agencies; and,

WHEREAS, The lawsuit alleges that such federal agencies have not complied with the 75% standard of alternative-fuel vehicles and failed to submit annual compliance reports to Congress; and,

WHEREAS, A loophole in the Energy Policy Act requires agencies to purchase vehicles capable of operating on alternative fuels, but does not actually prohibit such vehicles from using gasoline; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors urges the Department of Energy to enforce the goals and provisions of the 1992 Energy Policy Act and to remove any loophole that would deter any attempt at reducing gasoline consumption.
