Resolution urging the San Francisco Public Health Department, the Department of Children, Youth and their Families, and city agencies associated with youth issues to incorporate and adopt a platform encouraging family communication in their mission statement, educational projects and media campaigns and urging the Mayor to appropriate specified funds in the city's annual budget for departments to promote family communication in public education campaigns.

WHEREAS, Studies and research reports indicate that parental involvement in a child's life is a major influence in empowering youth to reject illicit drug and tobacco use, early sexual activity, and violent behavior; and,

WHEREAS, Family guidance and involvement in a child's life has proven to provide mutual understanding between youth and their parents, a deeper parental appreciation of youth, and respect for youth empowerment; and,

WHEREAS, Since the creation of the National Youth Anti-Drug Media Campaign, an outreach effort targeting family communication and parental involvement as the solution to educate and empower youth to reject illicit drugs, there has been a declining number of cases involving youth related drug and substance abuse; and,

WHEREAS, The promotion of family communication can be an effective solution to numerous problems affecting youth through an outreach project performed by a collaboration of city agencies involved with youth-related issues; and,

WHEREAS, In November 2001, the Youth Commission passed an resolution urging the Board of Supervisors to urge City agencies the promotion and use of the family

communication message in City advertisement campaigns and educational programs geared towards the youth of San Francisco; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors, on the advice of the San Francisco Youth Commission, urges the San Francisco Public Health Department, the Department of Children, Youth and their Families, and city departments associated with youth to incorporate and adopt a platform encouraging family communication in their mission statement, public education projects and media campaigns; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Mayor to appropriate specified funds in the city's annual budget for departments related to youth issues to promote family communication in public education campaigns; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Mayor and all city departments be provided with a copy of this resolution.
