WHEREAS, In 1876, San Francisco Archbishop Joseph Alemany asked the Dominican Sisters of Williamsburg, New York to send teachers to San Francisco to educate the children of the large influx of Catholic German families in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, Mother Pia Backes, O.P., at the age of twenty-four, arrived in San Francisco with two companions in response to the Archbishop's request on November 11, 1876; and

WHEREAS, The three young Dominicans taught for several years in St. Boniface Parish; and,

WHEREAS, In 1883, they set out on their own and built Immaculate Conception Academy at the corner of 24<sup>th</sup> and Guerrero Streets to teach the young girls of San Francisco's Mission District; and,

WHEREAS, In 1906, the Dominicans expanded the educational opportunities at ICA to include high school classes; and,

WHEREAS, Today, in addition to their continued work at ICA, the Dominican Sisters of Mission San Jose also minister at Saint James Elementary School, St. Anthony-Immaculate Conception School, the St. Anthony Foundation, the Institute of Catholic Educational Leadership, the Homeless Advocacy Project, On-Lok, St. Luke's Hospital, Esperanza Special Needs Program, and St. Elizabeth Elementary School; and,
