[Modification of State Grant Conditions]

Resolution authorizing the Mayor's Criminal Justice Council (MCJC) to modify San Francisco's comprehensive multi-agency juvenile justice plan, pursuant to Assembly Bill 1913 – known as the Schiff-Cardenas Crime Prevention Act of 2000 (CPA 2000) – in order to limit the scope of program evaluations in accordance with legislative mandates and budgetary restrictions.

WHEREAS, MCJC is the lead programmatic and fiscal agency for the county in administering CPA 2000, which provides funds for the county to implement a comprehensive multi-agency juvenile justice plan; and

WHEREAS, CPA 2000 requires that the county's local juvenile justice coordinating council update its Juvenile Justice Local Action Plan (LAP) and develop an expenditure plan, for CPA 2000; and

WHEREAS, CPA 2000 also requires that the county Board of Supervisors, and in the case of a city and county the Mayor, approve the updated LAP and the CPA 2000 expenditure plan; and

WHEREAS, the county of San Francisco's Board of Supervisors approved this LAP in Resolution Number 340-01; and

WHEREAS, the LAP in that approved Resolution set forth an evaluation component, pursuant to the requirement that each program funded through CPA 2000 be subject to evaluation and data collection; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco's updated LAP included an evaluation component that was broader in scope than legislatively mandated; and

WHEREAS, MCJC has determined that the cost of administering the evaluation as included in the updated LAP will far exceed funds available for the evaluation component; and

WHEREAS, the California Board of Corrections has determined that all substantive changes to any county's LAP must be approved by its Board of Supervisors; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the City and County of San Francisco hereby amends its Juvenile Justice LAP to include a modified evaluation plan; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County assures that the Board of Supervisors has reviewed and approves the modified evaluation plan set forth in the amended Juvenile Justice LAP.
