[Permitting Undocumented Immigrants to the Federal Office Building.]

Resolution urging the United States Federal Office Building and the Office of the Internal Revenue Service to permit entry into the building by immigrants regardless of their immigration status to carry on normal business in the building.

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco is a Sanctuary City recognizing the tremendous contributions that immigrants make to the welfare of San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, Immigrants, regardless of their immigration status, have a legal obligation to file their tax returns with the Internal Revenue Service; and,

WHEREAS, Many immigrants must obtain their Tax ID Number directly from the offices of the Internal Revenue Service located in the United States Federal Office Building to be able to file their tax returns; and,

WHEREAS, The current policy of the United States Federal Office Building in San Francisco and the office of the Internal Revenue Services is to deny immigrants without "legally approved identification" entry into the building to obtain their Tax ID Number, thereby denying them the ability to comply with their legal obligation to file their tax returns; and,

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco recognizes this as an immigrant rights issue that can be easily addressed by the Federal Office Building and the Internal Revenue Service by recognizing alternate forms of identification for undocumented immigrants to permit entry into the building to carry on normal business; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the United State Federal Office Building and the Office of the Internal Revenue Service to permit entry into the building of immigrants regardless of their immigration status to carry on normal business in the building.
