[Proposition B Implementation Plan Date.]

Resolution urging the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission to complete its implementation plan of Proposition B and H by April 15, 2002.

WHEREAS, The voters of San Francisco overwhelmingly adopted Proposition B, the measure authorizing the Public Utilities Commission to issue \$100 million in revenue bonds for solar and renewable energy programs; and,

WHEREAS, The voters also passed Proposition H overwhelmingly, which allows the Board of Supervisors to issue revenue bonds for solar and renewable energy programs; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco remains firmly committed to becoming a leader in solar energy, and California's ongoing energy concerns have only reaffirmed the importance of finding better means of producing energy; and,

WHEREAS, the single biggest contributor to global warming is pollution from coal and oil fired power plants; and,

WHEREAS, the majority of the world's Nobel prize winning scientists have signed a letter to the United Nations stating that global warming is the single biggest threat to the planet; and,

WHEREAS, solar energy offers a clean, reliable, silent way to make electricity that will help make our energy supply more secure while reducing greenhouse gases; and,

WHEREAS, solar energy systems are remarkably durable as evidenced by the fact that the first solar arrays installed forty years ago are still in operation; and,

WHEREAS, because of our technology-based economy, San Francisco is more dependent on electricity than ever before; and,

WHEREAS, as an earthquake-prone city, San Francisco is especially vulnerable to grid failures; and,

WHEREAS, solar energy systems generate electricity at the source where it is consumed and will provide power even when the electrical grid fails; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco should set the gold standard when it comes to environmentally sound practices and energy production; and,

WHEREAS, The Moscone Convention Center is currently soliciting bids for the first large-scale solar energy project in the City, offering a great opportunity for the city to implement Propositions B and H; and,

WHEREAS, The PUC is developing a 10-year implementation plan for Propositions B and H that prioritizes the largest and most practical projects to be completed first in order to insure effective implementation of the bond programs; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors hereby urges the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission to complete its solar implementation plan by April 15, 2002.
