[Assembly Bill 2677- Preferential Parking Programs]

Resolution urging the California State Legislature to adopt and Governor Gray Davis to sign Assembly Bill (AB) 2677, which would authorize State and local municipalities to establish preferential parking programs for low emission reduction vehicles and environmentally viable transportation alternatives.

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Bay Area yields some of the highest pollution rates in the nation; and,

WHEREAS, Within our diverse and populous community there is a necessity to ensure the safety of our environment and our air supply; and,

WHEREAS, The introduction of initiatives such as preferential parking incentives can preserve our environment through the protection of urban air quality and provide a means to further support environmentally safe transportation alternatives, including the promotion of clean air transportation; and,

WHEREAS, Preferential parking programs can provide reserved or free parking spaces for fuel-efficient or clean air vehicles, and serve as a means to promote environmentally safe transportation and the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions; and,

WHEREAS, Current State law prohibits the introduction and initiation of preferential transportation initiatives, including the introduction of preferential parking; and,

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 2677, authored by Assemblymember Joe Nation, amends the California Vehicle Code to allow municipalities the flexibility of initiating and promoting environmentally viable transportation alternatives, particularly the initiation of preferential parking programs; and,

SUPERVISOR NEWSOM BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WHEREAS, The passage of Assembly Bill 2677 will provide a means by which we can promote and ensure a safe and healthy environment by reducing pollution rates; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco does hereby the California State Legislature to adopt and Governor Gray Davis to sign Assembly Bill (AB) 2677, which would establish preferential parking programs for low emission reduction vehicles and environmentally viable transportation alternatives; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco supports Assembly Bill 2677 and does hereby ask that copies of this legislation be sent to our state representatives and His Honor the Mayor, with instructions that all actions be taken for its successful passage.
