Resolution urging the U.S. Congress to pass and President George W. Bush to sign HR 491, Filipino Veterans Equity Act, and SB 1042, Filipino Veterans Benefit Improvement Act.

WHEREAS, President Franklin D. Roosevelt on July 26, 1941 called into military service 140,000 Filipino World War II soldiers to serve under the command of American officers to defend the U.S. territory of the Philippines; and,

WHEREAS, American and Filipino forces under the command of Lt. Gen. Douglas MacArthur fought valiantly with great sacrifice against an overwhelming Japanese invading force, delaying the invaders' timetable by four months, thus allowing the U.S. forces to regain its military strength after the attack on Pearl Harbor; and,

WHEREAS, American and Filipino forces surrendered after the Battles for Bataan and Corregidor on April 9 and May 6, 1942 respectively, and suffered a horrible number of casualties in the Bataan Death March, in POW camps, and in the liberation campaign where 10,000 U.S. soldiers and 250,000 Filipino soldiers and civilians perished; and,

WHEREAS, On February 18, 1946 the U.S. Congress passed the Rescission Act that withdrew the U.S. veterans' status of Filipino WWII soldiers and their eligibility for veterans

benefits that were promised to them by President Harry Truman and Gen. Douglas MacArthur; and,

WHEREAS, In 1990, Congress passed legislation that allowed Filipino WWII veterans who proved their honorable military service to become naturalized U.S. citizens; and,

WHEREAS, The majority of the 12,000 surviving Filipino veterans who are U.S. citizens live in poverty and receive minimum benefits (SSI and Medicaid), and die at a 57 percent higher rate than their American comrades because of the lack of access to VA medical facilities; and,

WHEREAS, The majority of Filipino veterans are denied eligibility for VA medical care and disability pensions provided by the Veterans Administration to their U.S. comrades; and,

WHEREAS, Rep. Benjamin Gilman and Rep. Bob Filner have sponsored the Filipino Veterans Equity Act, HR 491, and Senator Daniel Inouye has introduced the Filipino Veterans Benefits Improvement Act, SB 1042, that would restore full official recognition of surviving Filipino WWII veterans; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco does hereby urge the U.S. Congress to pass and President George W. Bush to sign HR 491, the Filipino Veterans Equity Act, and SB 1042, the Filipino Veterans Benefit Improvement Act; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors shall send copies of this resolution to President George W.

Bush, to the California congressional delegation, and to Senators Dianne Feinstein and Barbara Boxer.
