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[Direct Access to Housing and Master Lease Program Expansion]

Resolution directing the Department of Public Health and the Department of Human Services to provide the Board of Supervisors with a proposed expansion plan for 500 additional units in the Direct Access to Housing Program and 500 additional units in the SRO Master Lease Program by April 22, 2002.

Whereas, The Department of Public Health's Direct Access to Housing (DAH) program provides access to permanent housing for San Francisco's most vulnerable homeless population, including persons who have been chronically homeless; and

Whereas, This is a population whose life on the street often includes or leads to life threatening illness, involuntary hospitalization, incarceration and death; and

Whereas, Each DAH building has on-site support services that can include case management, mental health and substance abuse services, medical services, basic living skills, benefit advocacy, vocational services, support groups and meals; and

Whereas, The DAH program utilizes a network of City and community-based agencies to assist clients in gaining access to the housing, providing entry points including emergency homeless shelters, street outreach teams, case management programs and a range of Department of Public Health's programs and institutions; and

Whereas, The DAH program currently operates four residential buildings with a total of 295 units, including the Pacific Bay Inn with 76 SRO units, the Windsor Hotel with 94 SRO units, the LeNain Hotel with 91 SRO units, and the Broderick Street Residential Care Facility with 34 units of licensed residential care; and

Whereas, The DAH program is in the process of adding a total of 109 additional units in FY 01-02, including 54 SRO units at the Star Hotel and 55 SRO units at the Camelot Hotel; and

Whereas, The DAH program serves clients who are often struggling with mental health, substance abuse, and unmet primary care needs and revolving through emergency care settings such as shelters emergency rooms, jails and other institutions, often at significant public expense; and

Whereas, The Department of Human Services operates the SRO Master Lease program which currently provides 803 case-managed SRO rooms for eligible homeless clients participating in the City's Personal Assistance Employment Services (PAES) job training program, homeless Supplemental Security Income Pending (SSIP) recipients, homeless Supplemental Security Income recipients, homeless Supplemental Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) recipients, homeless Veteran's Administration (VA) Benefits recipients and homeless individuals working in San Francisco with net earnings between \$350 and \$832 per month for four continuous months who are referred by agencies with Memoranda of Understanding (MOUs) with DHS; and

Whereas, The SRO Master Lease program provides a service-enriched environment for program participants that is far more stable and conducive to successful job-training efforts than the City's shelter system; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the Board of Supervisors hereby directs the Department of Public Health (DPH) and the Department of Human Services (DHS) to develop detailed plans to implement expansion programs for the DPH DAH and DHS Master Lease programs by 500 units and 500 units respectively in FY 02-03; and be it

Further Resolved, That the Department of Public Health and the Department of Human Services shall provide the following information to the Board of Supervisors not later than April 22, 2002:

- A proposed mix of housing types including at least 500 DPH DAH units (including licensed units) and 500 DHS Master Lease or equivalent units, with an emphasis on proposals to acquire and rehabilitate SRO Hotels;
- A proposed budget for providing the housing, broken down by capital costs
 (acquisition and/or rehabilitation costs), lease costs and operating costs, including
 direct services;
- 3. A tentative list of sites appropriate for the DAH and DHS Master Lease programs;
- 4. A proposed phase-in timeline for the various sites;
- 5. Proposed funding sources for program expansion;
- 6. Proposed mechanisms to provide for eventual City ownership of proposed sites;
- 7. Proposed client grievance procedures; and
- 8. A proposed expansion of eligibility for DHS Master Lease rooms, including seniors, CAAP recipients performing workfare and CAAP recipients with disabilities who are not SSI pending.
