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[Opposing Hastings Garage Proposal.]

Resolution urging the Board of Directors of the University of California Hastings College of Law to reject its proposed Tenderloin area parking garage in favor of a community-supported mixed-use development.

WHEREAS, The Garage proposed by the University of California Hastings College of Law to be constructed at Golden Gate Avenue and Larkin Street in San Francisco contradicts the Transit First policy of the City and the County of San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, The proposed Hastings Garage is expected to induce increased automobile use in one of San Francisco's most transit-rich neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, The proposed Garage is expected to further jeopardize pedestrian safety in the densely-populated Tenderloin neighborhood, which experiences the second-highest rate of pedestrian collisions in California; and

WHEREAS, Building a parking garage for the general public and for government agencies does not support the educational mission of Hastings, a public, taxpayer-supported, institution,

Whereas, the proposed Garage discounts the major housing deficit in San Francisco and disregards local, regional and state smart growth principles; and

WHEREAS, Hastings demolished 85 units of much-needed low-income housing on this site, and has a moral obligation to replace these affordable housing units

WHEREAS, Hastings' current proposal does not incorporate sufficient community input or improve the life of the community

WHEREAS, The development of the proposed Garage would deplete City revenue sources for programs such as public transit, local parks, and senior services by drawing users away from the nearby Civic Center Garage; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Garage is expected to negatively affect personal security in the Tenderloin area, particularly in the evenings, at nighttime and on weekends; and

WHEREAS, an alternative proposal could be developed to include uses more compatible with the area, and a mixed-use project that includes housing, could substantially improve the neighborhood by fostering positive vitality on the street, local economic development, and a create sense of safety from which the community and UC-Hastings College of Law would both benefit; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the Board of Directors of the University of California Hastings College of Law to reject its proposal for an 885-space parking garage in favor of a community-supported mixed-use development, that includes housing, and complies with the San Francisco General Plan and the City's own Transit First policy; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors directs the Clerk of Board of Supervisors to transmit copies of this resolution to our state representatives.
