WHEREAS, The bail schedule has not been adjusted since October of 1998 when Supervisor Jose Medina asked that a review be conducted; and,

WHEREAS, The bail schedule, when adjusted in 1998, was still lower than that of San Mateo County, Alameda County and Contra Costa County; and,

WHEREAS. The Board is concerned with the maintenance of a bail schedule that is comparable to bail schedules in neighboring counties for offenses involving violence and drug trafficking offenses; and,

WHEREAS, Based on San Francisco's lower bail schedules, most suspected drug crime defendants find it easier to get out of jail while awaiting a trial in the City than in any of the surrounding Bay Area counties; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco Board of Supervisors does hereby urge the presiding judge of the Municipal Superior Court to convene the Judge's Bail Committee in conjunction with the Superior Court to assess the bail schedule in order to determine what adjustments are needed to bring San Francisco in line with other Bay Area counties; and, be it
