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Resolution endorsing the position of the San Francisco Health Commission that cuts in the budget for the Department of Public Health are unwise, and urging the Mayor's Budget Office to submit a June 1st budget that includes full funding for the Health Department, including funding for "add-backs" and full funding for HIV/AIDS programs. recognizing that any identified waste, duplication or inefficiencies would be exempt from this request

WHEREAS, The Health and Human Services Committee held a hearing at San Francisco General Hospital on May 2, 2002 to discuss the Health Department's budget; and

WHEREAS, The Health and Human Services Committee learned from labor organizations, including the San Francisco Labor Council, Service Employees International Union Locals 250, 535 and 790, the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, University Professional and Technical Employees, California Nurses Association and others that budget cuts would result in decreased service quality and threaten our City's safety net; and,

WHEREAS, The Health and Human Services Committee learned from physicians and other employees of the University of California at San Francisco that San Francisco General Hospital is the cornerstone of our public health system, treating all San Franciscans and providing learning opportunities to medical students; and,

WHEREAS. The Health and Human Services Committee learned from representatives of community non-profits such as Central City Hospitality House, the Women's Community Clinic and the San Francisco Community Clinic Consortium that primary care, mental health, substance abuse and homeless service programs are already stretched thin and do not receive appropriate cost of living adjustments; and.

WHEREAS, The Health and Human Services Committee learned from San Franciscans concerned about AIDS and HIV that recent federal cuts of \$2.2 million in the Ryan White Comprehensive AIDS Resources Emergency (CARE) Act threaten the survival of people living with HIV; and,

WHEREAS, The hearing at San Francisco General Hospital was one in a series of meetings about the budget, and specifically designed to consider the mission, goals and objectives of the Health Department; and,

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Health Commission, appointed by Mayor Brown, heard similar testimony and adopted Resolution 3-02 that approved the Department's base budget and urged the Mayor and Board of Supervisors maintain the Department's services; and,

WHEREAS, Health Commission Resolution 3-02 is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. , which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein; and,

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Charter Section 9.101, the Mayor is responsible for the submission of a proposed budget to the Board of Supervisors; and,

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Board of Supervisors acknowledges that balancing the budget is a very difficult task, made increasingly more complex by less revenue; and,

WHEREAS, Health Commission Resolution 3-02 identifies proven financial practices that the Mayor's Budget Office could employ to balance the City's budget while protecting services for the most vulnerable San Franciscans; and,

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors has demonstrated its willingness to embrace innovative proposals to increase revenue recommended by the Mayor's Budget Office; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the Mayor's Budget Office to submit a June 1st budget that funds the Health Department at the same level of

funding contained in the Final Annual Appropriation Ordinance (AAO) Fiscal Year 2001-2002 budget, inclusive of "add-backs"; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors concurs with the San Francisco Health Commission that the Mayor should fund a contractor COLA to the Department's contractors and to the University of California—San Francisco that will allow these agencies to fund salary and operating increases without reducing the scope or volume of services provided to the clients and patients that they serve; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors concurs with the San Francisco Health Commission that the Mayor should specifically avoid service reductions outlined in the 10% service reduction proposal.
