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[Resolution supporting Mission Creek Bikeway and Greenbelt Concept Plan.]

Resolution supporting the Mission Creek Bikeway and Greenbelt Concept Plan prepared by the Rails-to-Trails Conservancy, Madrina Group, San Francisco Bicycle Coalition and the Department of Parking and Traffic and urging stakeholding agencies to work cooperatively in bringing the Concept Plan to fruition,

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors passed resolution # 474-01 in May, 2001, in support of the Mission Creek Bikeway, which outlined the justification and need for bikeway and pedestrian improvements along the abandoned Mission Creek railroad corridor; and,

WHEREAS, The Metropolitan Transportation Commission funded a planning and feasibility study of the project in 2001, which was completed in June 2002 after considerable input from community members, public agency representatives and project neighbors, by the Rails to Trails Conservancy, the Madrina Group, and the San Francisco Bicycle Coalition in association with the San Francisco Department of Parking and Traffic; and,

WHEREAS, the Bikeway will provide a safe route connecting the Mission District to Mission Bay and the South of Market neighborhoods, also helping to relieve congestion and to make the eastern waterfront more accessible to the residential neighborhoods of the west; and,

WHEREAS, the Bikeway offers an opportunity to revive and celebrate the natural history of the Mission Creek and to educate the public about the natural drainage hidden beneath the City streets and to promote the environmental stewardship of the San Francisco Bay and Estuary; and,

WHEREAS, the Bikeway offers an opportunity to salvage an important transportation asset, first used as a navigable waterway since the earliest settlements of the Spanish Mission and then as a railroad corridor; and,

WHEREAS, the Mission Creek corridor should be preserved, enhanced and updated to meet changing transportation needs of the residents of San Francisco; and,

WHEREAS, the Northeast Mission/ South of Market area is a park-poor area that would benefit from the proposed addition of new trees, greenery and landscaping along the Bikeway; and,

WHEREAS, a Concept Plan has been developed for the project, which has demonstrated the project to be feasible, but a number of design alternatives remain under consideration with regards to possible land acquisition and traffic intersection modifications; and,

WHEREAS, the preparation of meaningful cost estimates by the Department of Parking and Traffic depends on the further resolution and/or refinement of design alternatives; and,

WHEREAS, many different City departments will need to be involved in the final design and implementation of the Concept Plan, and no single City department is prepared to coordinate all the different entities involved; and,

WHEREAS, the San Francisco Transportation Agency is best equipped and qualified to take the lead role in the next phase of design, implementation and coordination of the transportation project; and,

WHEREAS, implementation of components of the MCB could be incorporated at minimal cost into existing City projects such as DPW's railroad track removal and street reconstruction program, if direction was given to them to do so; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco endorses the Concept Plan for the Mission Creek Bikeway as proposed; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, directs the San Francisco Transportation Authority to make the Mission Creek Bikeway an official project of the Transportation Authority, and to be the lead agency to coordinate future planning and implementation of the project; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Transportation Authority and other appropriate City agencies such as the Department of Public Works, Municipal Railway, Department of Parking & Traffic, City Planning and others to explore and pursue opportunities for land trades and street vacations that could be used to expand the public right-of-way along the corridor; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the San Francisco
Transportation Authority to work with other City agencies and project partners to help secure
outside funding for the project, as well help to incorporate project components into existing
City programs.
