Resolution urging the National Park Service, GGNRA, to make available to those requesting information on the ANPR process, documents showing the design, methodology, and protocols for analyzing Public Comment, the telephone survey, and any other Technical Information that will be supplied to the Federal panel for the ANPR process regarding Pet Management in the GGNRA.

WHEREAS, In 1979, after a thorough public process, the Golden Gate National Recreation Area (GGNRA) Citizen's Advisory Commission recommended a "voice control" policy for certain traditional areas of the GGNRA, a policy which was in place for over 20 years; and

WHEREAS, The GGNRA recently declared the "voice control" policy null and void and initiated a Pet Management rulemaking process called Advanced Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (ANPR) to decide whether an exception to National Park Service (NPS) regulations requiring pets to be leashed would be granted; and

WHEREAS, The ANPR documentation indicated that the close of the ANPR public comment period was April 12, 2002; and

WHEREAS, NPS has recently initiated a separate ANPR telephone survey without notification to the public or stakeholders; and

WHEREAS, The design, methodology, and evaluation protocols of the telephone survey and public comment analysis will have a strong bearing on the results; and

WHEREAS, In response to private requests, Freedom of Information Requests, and public requests at the July 23 meeting of the Citizens Advisory Commission, NPS has declined to provide design, methodology, and protocol information; and

WHEREAS, The people of San Francisco expect their government to be conducted openly, as evidenced by the passage of the Sunshine Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, Changes in GGNRA's "voice control" policy would have serious impact on San Francisco's citizens and City parks; and

WHEREAS, San Franciscans are mindful of Federal Judge William Alsup's characterization of the GGNRA's lack of openness, when he said in April 2000, "The [GGNRA's] outreach was not for the purpose of receiving input . . . The outreach was a public-relations campaign to create the appearance that the National Park Service wanted the public's input." (Case No. C 00-0087 WHA, Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, Filed 00 Apr 25, US District Court, p. 15); now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the National Park Service, Golden Gate National Recreation Area, to make available to those requesting information on the ANPR process, documents showing the design, methodology, and protocols for analyzing the Public Comment, the telephone survey, and any other Technical Information that will be supplied to the Federal panel for the ANPR process regarding Pet Management in the GGNRA.
