WHEREAS, Public input at the July 11<sup>th</sup> Hearing of the Neighborhoood Services and Recreation Committee of the San Francisco Board of Supervisors demonstrated that the Recreation and Parks Department, and particularly the Natural Areas Program, have not communicated fully with some neighborhood and park groups seeking park access and recreational opportunities other than those intended by the Natural Areas Program; and

WHEREAS, It is the responsibility of the Recreation and Parks Department to listen to and be responsive to the concerns and interests of San Francisco park users; and

WHEREAS, The actions of the Natural Areas Program staff have at times run counter to public input, and to mandated Recreation and Parks public policy; and

WHEREAS, The actions of the Natural Areas Program have resulted in a loss of confidence in the interest and objectivity of the Recreation and Parks Department towards the stated concerns of neighborhood, parks and interest groups; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urge the Recreation and
Parks Department to seek actively to restore the confidence of neighborhood and park
groups by working closely with, listening to, meeting with, and responding to such groups in
relation to their interests and concerns; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Recreation and Parks Department make its own planning and process more transparent by scanning and placing online the latest version of
