Resolution authorizing the Department of Public Health to accept and expend retroactively a grant allocation for up to \$4,136,456 for Fiscal Year 2002-03 funding from the State Department of Health Services for California Healthcare for Indigents Program (CHIP) funds for medical services to indigent persons, professional services, medical services contracts, materials and supplies, facilities rental, personal services, and indirect costs in the amount of \$60,541, based on 11.8% of administrative and fiscal intermediary costs; for the period of July 1, 2002, to June 30, 2003.

WHEREAS, The State of California passed the Tobacco Tax and Health Protection Act of 1988 (Proposition 99) and its implementing legislation, including Assembly Bill 75 (Isenberg), and Assembly Bill 99 (Isenberg), and Assembly Bill 3487 (Katz); and,

WHEREAS, This act and legislation makes monies available to counties to reimburse hospitals, physicians, and other providers for uncompensated care cost, for making capital improvements, and for implementing data systems; and,

WHEREAS, These funds have been anticipated and are reflected in the FY 2002-03 Annual Appropriation Ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, A significant part of this funding is to implement the California Healthcare for Indigents Program (CHIP) with its attendant funding; and,

WHEREAS, A percentage of these CHIP funds are allowed for administrative and indirect costs; and,

WHEREAS, Receipt of such funding requires a written application from the County Board of Supervisors, along with the provision of a number of assurances concerning use of such funds; and,

WHEREAS, Receipt of such funds will begin following approval of the application by the State and authorization by the County Board of Supervisors and the Mayor to accept and expend such funds; now, therefore, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Health is authorized to enter into the Agreement on behalf of the City.
