Resolution commending Rudolf Amenga-Etego and the Ghana National Coalition Against Privatization of Water for their commitment to universal access to safe, affordable water.

WHEREAS, In developing nations, over a billion people lack access to safe drinking water and 2.4 billion do not have adequate sanitation. Deaths continue to mount from preventable water related diseases such as cholera, dengue hemmorhagic fever, and malaria; and,

WHEREAS, According to the World Health Organization, no single intervention has greater impact on national development and public health than access to safe, affordable drinking water and proper sanitation; and,

WHEREAS, Public control and public accountability for water are key to achieving and maintaining access to affordable water; and,

WHEREAS, In Ghana where running water is a limited resource, the World Bank has required the government to privatize its urban water system which would impose higher rates on individuals and not address the serious need of sanitation; and,

WHEREAS, In response to the privatization agreement, Rudolf Amenga-Etego cofounded the Ghana National Coalition Against Privatization of Water, a broad consortium of organizations representing health professionals, academia, trade unions, students, disabled, and women's groups, and have been instrumental in raising public awareness about the privatization proposal, and calling for accountable public sector alternatives;" and,

WHEREAS, Local 21 of the International Federation of Professional and Technical Engineers Union, the Center for Policy Alternatives on Trade and Health (CPATH), and Public

Citizen are sponsoring a visit from Rudolf Amenga-Etego to San Francisco to discuss the dangers of multinational companies privatizing the sale of water; and,

WHEREAS, Mr. Amenga-Etego's visit will connect local and global efforts to protect safe water and educate individuals about the necessity of achieving and maintaining access to affordable water; now therefore, be it,

RESOLVED, The San Francisco Board of Supervisors welcome Rudolf Amenga-Etego and commend National Coalition Against the Privatization of Water in Ghana for their efforts to expand access to safe, affordable water and sanitation through publicly accountable systems in Ghana, the United States, and internationally.
