WHEREAS, Global Exchange has helped bring accountability to the garment industry and has educated the U.S. public about critical global issues; and,

WHEREAS, Sweatshop Watch has done an exemplary job bringing attention to the plight of workers in sweatshops in California as well as the rest of the nation and globe; and,

WHEREAS, The Union of Needletrades, Industrial and Textile Employees has supported workers throughout the world and holds corporations accountable for their actions on sweatshop issues; and,

WHEREAS, The Gap, Abercrombie & Fitch, Target, J.C. Penny, Lane Bryant Inc., The Limited, Inc., and Talbots, have joined 23 local manufacturers and 19 other retailers in settling this class action lawsuit thereby agreeing to comply with basic employment standards. participate in a monitoring program and pay into a fund established to pay back wages to current and former garment workers on Saipan; now, therefore, be it
