Resolution commending Dave Snyder on eleven years of service as the Executive Director of the San Francisco Bicycle Coalition and his efforts to improve conditions for bicycling in San Francisco.

WHEREAS, Dave Snyder served as the Executive Director of the San Francisco Bicycle Coalition (SFBC) for eleven years, from 1991 to 2002; and

WHEREAS, In the early 90's, the SFBC had a few hundred members, and grew to more than 4,000 members by 2002; and,

WHEREAS, The SFBC has been recognized as one of the most effective advocacy groups in the city, thanks to Dave Snyder's leadership; and,

WHEREAS, Bicycling has doubled in San Francisco in the past ten years, according to census data, one of the biggest jumps in any U.S. city; and,

WHEREAS, Dave Snyder played an integral part in creating the city's first Bicycle Plan, which was approved by the Board of Supervisors in 1997 and which has outlined many of the bike facility and policy improvements in the past five years; and,

WHEREAS, Dave Snyder serves on the Boards of Directors of the Regional Bicycle Advisory Committee in the Bay Area, the Thunderhead Alliance, which is a national coalition of bicycle advocacy groups, and SPUR, the San Francisco Planning and Urban Research Association; and,

WHEREAS, In September 2002, Dave left his position with the SFBC to become the Executive Director of Transportation for a Livable City (TLC), an organization with the goal of creating a more livable city through improved transportation choices, more housing, and safer, quieter streets; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That Board of Supervisors of San Francisco commends Dave Snyder for his outstanding work for the San Francisco Bicycle Coalition in the area of bicycle and transportation advocacy and wishes him well in his new endeavor.
