Resolution supporting "Principles for a More Secure San Francisco," as proposed by the Service Employees International Union, the largest security officer union in the nation, to provide higher standards for the private security industry.

WHEREAS, an estimated 8,000 security officers are employed in San Francisco; and WHEREAS, the events of September 11th have made apparent the importance of security officers in protecting the residents of San Francisco and billions of dollars of property; and,

WHEREAS, according 2000 data from the California Employment Development Department, security officers in the San Francisco Bay Area have an average hourly wage of \$9.50. Additionally, turnover in the industry is estimated at 100% to 300% annually and can be directly attributed to the low wages and lack of benefits offered to security officers; and,

WHEREAS, the Service Employees International Union with membership of more than 2,500 individuals in the San Francisco Bay Area and as the largest union of security officers in the United States, has proposed "Principals for a More Secure San Francisco" that seek to remedy issues facing the private security industry and its employees, and

WHEREAS, "Principals for a More Secure San Francisco" calls for higher standards for private security in San Francisco through a partnership between building owners, contractors, security experts, security officers, and organized labor to evaluate and implement security procedures and technologies that will better protect lives and property; and

WHEREAS, "Principals for a More Secure San Francisco" calls for enhanced coordination among security, police, fire and rescue personnel to ensure a comprehensive, integrated approach to disaster preparedness and emergency response, and

WHEREAS, "Principals for a More Secure San Francisco" calls for a more professional, stable security workforce by providing high-quality training, living wages and health insurance benefits, paid sick days and paid holidays, as well as the implementation of a uniform citywide contract for private security personnel, and,

WHEREAS, "Principals for a More Secure San Francisco" calls for responsible security contractors and building owners to ensure compliance with all labor and employment laws, respect for the rights of employees to join together in the union of their choice, payment of fair wages, provision of training commensurate with job responsibilities, heightened levels of job security and employer-paid family medical insurance; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco hereby supports the "Principles for a More Secure San Francisco," as proposed by the Service Employees International Union, to provide higher standards for the private security industry.
