["Spaceship Earth" Sculpture]

Resolution recommending the acceptance of a gift, "Spaceship Earth" as a sculptural monument to David R. Brower, first Executive Director of the Sierra Club.

WHEREAS, A sculptural monument to the internationally acclaimed environmentalist David R. Brower, first Executive Director of the Sierra Club and founder of Friends of the Earth and Earth Island Institute, is a offered as a gift to the City and County of San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, David Brower, as s a head of the Sierra Club and then Friends of the Earth from 1952 onward, played a leading role in preserving lands that now comprise the Golden Gate National Recreation Area and the Point Reyes National Seashore; and

WHEREAS, Earth Island Institute under David Brower's leadership incubated many organizations that have promoted environmental sustainability on local, national and international levels, including Rainforest Action Network, Urban Habitat Program and Bluewater Network; and

WHEREAS, Earth Island Institute's Brower Youth Awards annually funds six young people who do work that promotes environmental sustainability; and

WHEREAS, The monument to David Brower will be called 'Spaceship Earth' as a reflection of his recognition that "We are all together on the Spaceship Earth. There are no connecting flights, no stops, infinite destinations, and no passengers-only crew"; and

WHEREAS. The monument will be a globe of the Earth 15 feet in diameter and 20 feet high, assembled from 88 blocks of blue quartzite rock that have already been cut to the specifications of the sculptor Eino; and

WHERAS, Eino, born in Finland in 1940 and came to the United States in 1962, has completed major public artwork that is currently placed in Atlanta, Berkeley, Helsinki, Los Angeles, Santa Monica, Stockholm, Toronto and Washington, D.C. and his large stone piece 'Snowflake' was installed as the centerpiece of the Olympic in Park City, Utah for the 2002 Winter Olympic Games; and

WHEREAS, The memorial is meant to be viewed by San Francisco's diverse citizenry as an ongoing instrument for promoting environmental sustainability; and

WHEREAS. The anonymous donors of 'Spaceship Earth', a couple residing in the San Francisco Bay Area, wish to celebrate David Brower's environmental consciousness and that of the City in which he worked and lived, San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, The anonymous donors of 'Spaceship Earth' commit to absorbing the costs related to the installation and landscaping of the sculpture, once a suitable site is agreed on by donors, the Board of Supervisors, the Arts Commission and other relevant bodies within the City and County of the City of San Francisco; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors recommends acceptance of the gift of 'Spaceship Earth' sculpture to the City and County of San Francisco once the desired location of the sculpture is established and agreed upon by the donors, the Arts Commission and the Board of Supervisors.
