Resolution urging the Department of Public Works (DPW) and the City Architect, in consultation with the San Francisco Unified School District (SFUSD), to suggest possible options for DPW assistance in providing expertise and services to the School District regarding facility repairs and managing construction projects pursuant to the SFUSD Facilities Master Plan.

WHEREAS, The City, through the Department of Public Works, and the San Francisco Unified School District have entered into a Memorandum of Understanding whereby DPW has agreed to provide professional services and project management for SFUSD projects; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to this Memorandum of Understanding, the Department of Public Works has agreed to provide architectural, engineering, and other professional services for projects at School District facilities as requested by SFUSD; and

WHEREAS, The Memorandum of Understanding is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. , v , which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein; and

WHEREAS, The School District is developing a Facilities Master Plan which will in future phases provide an assessment of existing facilities, identify those facilities requiring repair, and provide a cost estimate for repairs; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Public Works and the City Architect can provide expertise to the School District in developing the Facilities Master Plan with respect to assessing existing facilities, identifying facilities requiring repairs, and providing cost estimates for repairs; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Public Works has developed an indirect costs program that allows for the recovery of administrative costs from multiple funding sources which could serve as a guide to the possible development of such a program within SFUSD; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Public Works and the City Architect can provide this assistance, expertise, and services to the School District in an effort to reduce the cost impact of facility reconstruction to the School District; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Department of Public Works and the City Architect, in consultation with the San Francisco Unified School District, to suggest possible options for DPW assistance in providing expertise and services to the School District regarding facility repairs and managing construction projects, including but not limited to DPW project management or joint SFUSD/DPW project management, pursuant to the existing Memorandum of Understanding or a new Memorandum of Understanding; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Department of Public Works to work with the SFUSD to develop an indirect costs program for the School District to recover administrative costs from multiple funding sources; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Department of Public Works and the City Architect to provide such assistance, expertise, and services to the School District in an effort to reduce the cost impact of facility reconstruction to the School District and enhance project delivery.
