Resolution supporting efforts to curb global warming and to develop partnerships with communities in India that allow for the sharing of information on emission reduction programs.

WHEREAS, the world's leading climate scientists have documented a clear global warming trend and the adverse impact of particulate emissions caused by human activity; and

WHEREAS, global warming of the magnitude now predicted by the scientific community will cause costly disruption of human and natural systems throughout the world; and

WHEREAS, climate change is among the most critical threats to the sustainability of our planet, and the health of millions of people is at risk from smog, rising air temperature, increased disease, more frequent extreme weather events and rising sea levels; and

WHEREAS, the International Panel on Climate Change has determined that stabilizing concentrations of greenhouse gases in the atmosphere will require emission reductions in excess of 60% of current emissions; and

WHEREAS, India has among the fastest growing populations on the planet and is the seventh largest emitter of greenhouse gases; and

WHEREAS, the current administration in Washington, D.C. has demonstrated an alarming unwillingness to play a leadership role in climate protection; and

WHEREAS, President George W. Bush rejected the Kyoto Protocol on global warming outright, which is a modest first step toward greenhouse gas reductions, 178 countries reached agreement on the Kyoto Protocol in July, 2001; and

WHEREAS, action taken by local communities throughout the world, which provide working models of emission reduction initiatives, hold promise to initiate international leadership toward implementing clean climate programs and technologies; and

WHEREAS, over 370 cities in the United States and throughout the world are completing inventories of greenhouse gas emissions in their communities and adopting reduction targets as part of the International Council for Local Environmental Initiatives' Cities for Climate Protection program; and

WHEREAS, the International Council for Local Environmental Initiatives and its Cities for Climate Protection campaign is currently partnering with San Francisco's Department of the Environment and an extensive network of cities in India on climate protection programs; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors reiterates its support for the Kyoto Protocol, and call upon international leaders including George W. Bush to support this Protocol; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors indicates its strong support for the development of formal partnerships between the City and County of San Francisco and several Indian cities to share technical and policy information necessary to implement emission reduction programs.
