150658 [Initiative Ordinance - Environment Code - Clean Energy Right to Know Act] Sponsors: Breed; Avalos, Wiener and Christensen

Motion ordering submitted to the voters an Ordinance amending the Environment Code to define the terms Clean Energy, Green Energy, and Renewable Greenhouse Gas-Free Energy to provide San Francisco residents and businesses accurate information regarding electric power; and requiring the Department of the Environment to identify power sourced from nuclear power plants, at an election to be held on November 3, 2015.

Findings;" Page 2, Lines 7-9, by revising the definition of "Detention," Lines 11-13, by adding the definition of "Gender Identity," and Lines 20-23, by revising the definition of "Use of Force;" Page 3, Line 10, by adding 'or admonishment', and Lines 11-21, by changing the way an Officer shall collect information related to perceived age, race or ethnicity, and sex during an encounter; Page 4, Lines 11-19, by revising the Quarterly Analysis and Reporting procedures, and Lines 22 and 23, by adding 'or ethnicity': Page 5, by adding 'or ethnicity' to all references to reporting on "race," Lines 5-6, by removing the reporting of encounters that occur when the reported sex differs from the reported gender identity, Lines 20-21, by adding requirements to report on various "Uses of Force" instances, and Lines 24-25 through Page 6, Line 1, by adding specific requirements to report on "Arrests;" Page 6, Lines 12-18, by adding requirements that the Police Department obtain statistics from the Office of Citizen Complaints on allegations of bias based on race or ethnicity, gender, or gender identity to include in its report, and Lines 19-20, by allowing the custody division and field division reporting data to be separated; and Page 7. Line 25. by establishing a January 1, 2017, operative date for Section 96A.2. The motion carried by the following vote:
