LEGISLATION UNDER THE 30-DAY RULE

NOTE: The following legislation will not be considered at this meeting. Board Rule 3.22 provides that when an Ordinance or Resolution is introduced which would CREATE OR REVISE MAJOR CITY POLICY, the Committee to which the legislation is assigned shall not consider the legislation until at least thirty days after the date of introduction. The provisions of this rule shall not apply to the routine operations of the departments of the City or when a legal time limit controls the hearing timing. In general, the rule shall not apply to hearings to consider subject matter when no legislation has been presented, nor shall the rule apply to resolutions which simply URGE action to be taken.

Meeting Procedures

The Board of Supervisors is the legislative body of the City and County of San Francisco. The Board has several standing conwhere legislation is the subject of hearings at which members of the public are urged to testify. The full Board does not hold public hearing on measures which have been heard in committee.

Board procedures do not permit: 1) persons in the audience to vocally express support or opposition to statements by Supervi by other persons testifying; 2) ringing and use of cell phones, pagers, and similar sound-producing electronic devices; 3) brin displaying signs in the meeting room; and 4) standing in the meeting room.

Each member of the public will be allotted the same maximum number of minutes to speak as set by the President or Chair at beginning of each item or public comment, excluding City representatives; except that public speakers using interpretation as will be allowed to testify for twice the amount of the public testimony time limit. If simultaneous interpretation services are u speakers will be governed by the public testimony time limit applied to speakers not requesting interpretation assistance. Pers attending the meeting in-person who want a document placed on the overhead for display should clearly state such and subse remove the document when they want the screen to return to live coverage of the meeting. Members of the public providing remotely via telephone who want a document displayed should provide in advance of the meeting to the Clerk of the Board (bos.legislation@sfgov.org), clearly state such during testimony, and subsequently request the document be removed when the the screen to return to live coverage of the meeting.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: The public is encouraged to testify at Committee meetings. Persons unable to attend the me may submit to the City, by the time the proceedings begin, written comments regarding the agenda items. These comments w made a part of the official public record and shall be brought to the attention of the Board of Supervisors. Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)

The ADA is a civil rights law that protects people with different types of disabilities from discrimination in all aspects of soci More specifically, Title II of the ADA requires that all programs offered through the state and local government such as the C County of San Francisco must be accessible and usable to people with disabilities. The ADA and City policy require that peo disabilities have equal access to all City services, activities, and benefits. People with disabilities must have an equal opportuparticipate in the programs and services offered through the City and County of San Francisco. If you believe your rights und ADA are violated, contact the ADA Coordinator.

Ordinance No. 90-10 added Section 2A.22.3 to the Administrative Code, which adopted a Citywide Americans with Disabilit Reasonable Modification Policy that requires City departments to: (1) provide notice to the public of the right to request reasonable modification; (2) respond promptly to such requests; (3) provide appropriate auxiliary aids and services to people with disabilit ensure effective communication; and (4) train staff to respond to requests from the public for reasonable modification, and th the Mayor's Office on Disability to provide technical assistance to City departments responding to requests from the public fc reasonable modifications. The Board of Supervisors and Office of the Clerk of the Board support the Mayor's Office on Disa help make San Francisco a city where all people enjoy equal rights, equal opportunity, and freedom from illegal discriminatic disability rights laws.

Under Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code, Section 1.127, no person or entity with a financial interest in a land use r pending before the Board of Appeals, Board of Supervisors, Building Inspection Commission, Commission on Community II and Infrastructure, Historic Preservation Commission, Planning Commission, Port Commission, or the Treasure Island Devel Authority Board of Directors, may make a campaign contribution to a member of the Board of Supervisors, the Mayor, the C Attorney, or a candidate for any of those offices, from the date the land use matter commenced until 12 months after the boar commission has made a final decision, or any appeal to another City agency from that decision has been resolved.
