Resolution declaring the intent of the City and County of San Francisco to reimburse certain expenditures from proceeds of future bonded indebtedness; authorizing the Director of the Mayor's Office of Housing to submit an application and related documents to the California Debt Limit Allocation Committee (CDLAC) to permit the issuance of qualified mortgage revenue bonds in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$30,000,000 for 1239 Turk Street (Rosa Parks II Senior Housing); authorizing and directing the Director to direct the Controller's Office to hold in trust an amount not to exceed \$100,000 in accordance with CDLAC procedures; authorizing the Director to certify to CDLAC that the City has on deposit the required amount; authorizing the Director to pay an amount equal to such deposit to the State of California if the City fails to issue the qualified mortgage revenue bonds; approving, for purposes of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, the issuance and sale of mortgage revenue bonds by the City in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$30,000,000; authorizing and directing the execution of any documents necessary to implement this Resolution; and ratifying and approving any action heretofore taken in connection with the Project (as defined herein) and the Application (as defined herein).

4. 130658 [Restated Option Agreement - Sale of Surplus Real Property in Mountain View to MV Urban Village Homes, LLC - \$8,100,000]

Resolution approving a Restated Option Agreement for the sale of surplus lands under the jurisdiction of the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC) located in Mountain View, Santa Clara County, California near the intersection of Whisman and Tyrella Avenues, to MV Urban Village Homes, LLC, a California limited liability company (Optionee), a joint venture between KMJ Urban Communities, LLC (KMJ), and SummerHill Homes, LLC (SummerHill) in the amount of \$8,100,000, and reserving an easement to the SFPUC; authorizing the Director of Property or the SFPUC's General Manager to execute documents, make modifications, and take actions in furtherance of this Resolution; and adopting findings that the transactions contemplated by the Restated Option Agreement are consistent with the City's General Plan and with the Eight Priority Policies of City Planning Code Section 101.1.

Meeting Procedures

The Board of Supervisors is the legislative body of the City and County of San Francisco. The Board has several standing committees where ordinances and resolutions are the subject of hearings at which members of the public are urged to testify. The full Board does not hold a second public hearing on measures which have been heard in committee.

Board procedures do not permit: 1) persons in the audience to vocally express support or opposition to statements by Supervisors or by other persons testifying; 2) ringing and use of cell phones, pagers, and similar sound-producing electronic devices; 3) bringing in or displaying signs in the meeting room; and 4) standing in the meeting room.

Each member of the public will be allotted the same maximum number of minutes to speak as set by the President or Chair at the beginning of each item or public comment, excluding City representatives, except that public speakers using translation assistance will be allowed to testify for twice the amount of the public testimony time limit. If simultaneous translation services are used, speakers will be governed by the public testimony time limit applied to speakers not requesting translation assistance. Members of the public who want a document placed on the overhead for display should clearly state such and subsequently remove the document when they want the screen to return to live coverage of the meeting.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: The public is encouraged to testify at Committee meetings. Persons unable to attend the meeting may submit to the City, by the time the proceedings begin, written comments regarding the agenda items above. These comments will be made a part of the official public record and shall be brought to the attention of the Board of Supervisors. Written communications should be submitted to the Clerk of the Board, Clerk of a Committee or its members: 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102. Communications which are not received prior to the hearing may be delivered to the Clerk of the Committee at the hearing and you are encouraged to bring enough copies for distribution.
