[Creating City Website for Canadian Pharmacies.]

Resolution urging the Department of Public Health to develop a list of approved Canadian pharmacies and to develop an online resource to educate San Francisco residents about how to safely import pharmaceuticals from Canadian pharmacies.

WHEREAS, According to a report by the National Legislators Association on Prescription Drug Prices, prescription drugs are an average of 30-65% more expensive in the United States then abroad, and are increasing an average of 14% each year; and

WHEREAS, According to recent figures published by the United States Department of Health and Human Services, the average brand name drug cost more than \$72 per prescription; and,

WHEREAS, Every San Franciscan has the right to access affordable prescription drugs, without needing to make decisions about purchasing necessary pharmaceuticals or paying their rent or basic expenses; and,

WHEREAS, Recently, the State of Minnesota unveiled a website offering directions to citizens to safely order prescriptions from Canadian pharmacies, after establishing a set of screening criteria to verify safe practices that include requirements for a prescription from an American doctor and providing periodic reports to the Minnesota Department of Human Services regarding consumer complaints about their website; and,

WHEREAS, The State of Minnesota's Department of Human Services chose two approved pharmacies to re-import drugs for Minnesotans and the City of Springfield. Massachusetts currently contracts with a Canadian pharmacy to re-import prescriptions for subscribing public employees; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco has previously expressed it's support for re-importation of pharmaceuticals from acceptable Canadian pharmacies for public employees to generate cost savings; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges the Department of Public Health to study best practices from other states, counties and cities around the country which have initiated re-importation programs to develop a set of criterion for Canadian pharmacies; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Department of Public Health to create an online resource to educate and assist San Franciscans about purchasing prescriptions from approved Canadian pharmacies; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Department of Public Health to complete their study and develop online educational resources within 90 days of the adoption of this resolution.
