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Resolution approving the proposed helipad at the UCSF Medical Center At Mission Bay under California Public Utilities Code Section 21661.5 and adopting environmental findings under the California Environmental Quality Act, including a mitigation monitoring and reporting program and a statement of overriding considerations.

WHEREAS, The University of California, San Francisco ("UCSF") desires to construct and operate a rooftop helipad (the "helipad") atop its planned UCSF Medical Center at Mission Bay; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors (the "Board") is required under California Public Utilities Code Section 21661.5, to approve the helipad before the California Department of Transportation, Aeronautics Division, will consider approval of a permit for the helipad; and

WHEREAS, The UCSF Medical Center at Mission Bay will include a new, state-of-theart facility for the UCSF Children's Hospital, which provides a vast array of expert care from routine immunizations to the most advanced treatments for serious, life-threatening childhood diseases; and

WHEREAS, Rapid and direct access to highly specialized medical care is vital when a child is critically ill, a baby is born with a devastating birth defect, or a pregnant woman is in distress; and

WHEREAS, Community hospitals are not able to provide the resources, level of care, and numbers of pediatric specialists that are available at UCSF Children's Hospital; and

WHEREAS, UCSF desires the expertise of the UCSF Children's Hospital to be available to the children of San Francisco, the Bay Area, and beyond; and

WHEREAS, A helipad serving the new UCSF Children's Hospital would provide much more immediate access for the most critical of these children who are transferred from other hospitals; and

WHEREAS, On November 2, 1998, the Board of Supervisors by Ordinance No. 335-98 approved and adopted the Mission Bay South Redevelopment Plan, which establishes the land uses for the redevelopment area; and

WHEREAS, The new UCSF Children's Hospital is located within the Mission Bay South Redevelopment Plan Area; and

WHEREAS, On October 12, 2005, by memorandum, which is incorporated into this resolution by this reference, the Executive Director of the San Francisco Redevelopment Agency determined as provided by Section 302 of the Mission Bay South Redevelopment Plan that the UCSF hospital development is a permitted secondary use under the Mission Bay South Redevelopment Plan Area as it will generally conform to the redevelopment objectives and planning and design controls and will make a positive contribution to the character of the Plan Area; and

WHEREAS, The Regents of the University of California ("The Regents") and the University of California ("University"), as the lead agency under the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"), California Public Resources Code Sections 21000 et seq. and the California Code of Regulations Sections 15000 et seq., ("CEQA Guidelines"), for the UCSF Medical Center at Mission Bay prepared and certified the Final Environmental Impact Report on the UCSF Medical Center at Mission Bay on September 17, 2008 (the "MCMB EIR"); and

WHEREAS, In regards to the helipad, the MCMB EIR identified helicopter noise impacts and mitigation measures related to helipad operations and identified the need to continue working with the community to develop a Residential Sound Reduction Program ("RSRP"); and

WHEREAS, The Regents adopted CEQA Findings, including a statement of overriding considerations and a mitigation monitoring and reporting program and approved the first phase of the UCSF Medical Center at Mission Bay on September 17, 2008, which documents are on file with the Clerk of the Board in File No. \_\_\_\_\_\_ and incorporated in this resolution by this reference; The Regents deferred approval of the helipad operations until the RSRP and associated environmental review pursuant to CEQA were completed; and

WHEREAS, UCSF has worked diligently with residents of the neighborhoods adjoining Mission Bay to develop the RSRP for owners of homes that may be disproportionately impacted by noise associated with helipad operations; and

WHEREAS, Following development of the RSRP, the University prepared a supplement to the MCMB EIR entitled Final Supplemental Environmental Impact Report for the UCSF Medical Center at Mission Bay – Residential Sound Reduction Program for Helicopter Operations ("SEIR"); and

WHEREAS, The SEIR was prepared to update the helicopter noise analysis of the MCMB EIR by evaluating the effectiveness of the RSRP mitigation measure in reducing the noise impacts identified in the MCMB EIR, as well as providing updated noise contours using the most recent Integrated Noise Model developed by the Federal Aviation Administration; and

WHEREAS, The University, through its Executive Vice President for Business
Operations, certified the SEIR as adequate in accordance with CEQA on April 22, 2009,
adopted CEQA Findings related to the impacts of the operation of the helipad, adopted the
RSRP mitigation measure to be implemented in addition to the mitigation measures previously
approved as part of its approval of the MCMB hospital project, adopted a statement of
overriding consideration relating to the significant and unavoidable impacts of helipad
operation, and having done so, approved helipad operations at the UCSF Medical Center at

Mission Bay; the University's approval, including CEQA findings, are on file with the Clerk of the Board in File No. \_\_090799 \_\_\_ and which are incorporated in this resolution by this reference; and

WHEREAS, The Board is a responsible agency as defined by CEQA Guidelines
Section 15381 and the Board through the Planning Department has complied with the
requirements for a responsible agency as set forth in CEQA Guidelines Section 15096; and

WHEREAS, The Board has reviewed the information contained in the MCMB EIR and the SEIR as relevant to this approval of the helipad and has reviewed the CEQA findings contained in The Regents' and University approval actions related to the Medical Center at Mission Bay and the helipad operation, including the statements of overriding considerations and the mitigation monitoring and reporting program; and;

WHEREAS, The Regents has already adopted the mitigation measures recommended in the MCMB EIR and SEIR and specifically, those mitigation measures related to the helipad and has authority to implement the mitigation measures and the Board has no direct authority to implement the mitigation measures; and

RESOLVED, That the MCMB EIR as supplemented and amended by the SEIR, prepared and certified as adequate by The Regents and the University, have been made

available for review by the Board and the public and these documents are part of the record before the Board; and

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board finds that the approval of the helipad is within the scope of the project analyzed in the MCMB EIR, as supplemented and amended by the SEIR; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board finds that since The Regents certified the MCMB EIR, as supplemented and amended by the SEIR, there have been no substantial project changes and no substantial changes in project circumstances that would require major revisions to the MCMB EIR beyond the further analysis in the SEIR due to the involvement of the new significant environmental effects or an increase in the severity of previously identified significant impacts, and there is no new information of substantial importance that would change the conclusions set forth in the MCMB EIR, as supplemented and amended by the SEIR; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Board has not identified any feasible alternative or additional feasible mitigation measures within its powers that would substantially lessen or avoid any significant effect the project would have on the environmental; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board hereby approves the rooftop helipad proposed for the UCSF Medical Center at Mission Bay as provided for under California Public Utilities Code Section 21661.5.
