Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. The Administrative Code is hereby amended by adding Chapter 96F, consisting of Sections 96F.1 and 96F.2, to read as follows:

CHAPTER 96F: COMMUNITY POLICING PLANS

SEC. 96F.1. COMMUNITY POLICING PLANS; FOOT AND BIKE PATROLS.

- Creation of District Station Community Policing Plans. The Police Department (a)("SFPD") shall continue to create a Community Policing Plan ("CPP") for each police district station that shall be publicly available and posted on SFPD's website and on each station's website.
- **Community Policing Plans.** The Police Department shall finalize the CPPs no later than January 1, 2023, and review and update them on an annual basis by January 1 of each year. The purpose of CPPs are to foster collaboration and open communication between police officers and

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
