Resolution designating August 2, 2025, as "Pete Escovedo Day" in the City and County of San Francisco; and celebrating the prolific work of the legendary percussionist and visual artist in his 90th year, culminating in the closing ceremony of the exhibit displaying his impact on Bay Area art and culture at the Mission Cultural Center for Latino Arts.

WHEREAS, Pete Escovedo grew up in the greater Bay Area, in a house that was filled with music and songs in Spanish, compelling him to pick up drums while at school in Oakland. California; and

WHEREAS, Pete Escovedo met the famous musician Tito Puente known as "El Rey de los Timbales | The King of the Timbales," who took Pete under his wing at an early age, taught him, cheered him on and helped him become the musician he is today as a pioneer of Latin Jazz, in which he is widely credited with breaking the barriers between Smooth Jazz. Salsa, Latin Jazz and contemporary music; and

WHEREAS, After much practice and encouragement from family and friends, Pete and his brother Coke formed the Escovedo Bros Latin Jazz Sextet, and the 14-24 piece Latin Big band called Azteca, bringing Latin Jazz to the West Coast and eventually around the world; and

WHEREAS, Because of his growing exposure as a powerful drummer, Pete was recognized by Santana, who asked the Escovedo brothers to go on tour with his band, which led them to playing in venues from Oakland to Paris; and

WHEREAS, Pete was not only a musical visionary, he also has always had visual artistic talent, and has been painting canvas after canvas with beautiful, bold colors, textures

and images that tell stories about his family, culture, identity, political and social justice themes; and

WHEREAS, Pete Escovedo's art has earned global recognition in the contemporary art world: and

WHEREAS, Just as his mother and father did with Pete and his siblings, Pete raised his four children on music and art, which has led to more renown artists hailing from the Bay Area, including famous singer-percussionists Sheila E., Peter Michael Escovedo III, Juan Escovedo, and dancer/choreographer Zina Escovedo; and

WHEREAS, His music has been lauded throughout the music industry, including the Latin Grammy Lifetime Achievement Award in 2021 that he received together with his daughter, Sheila E; and

WHEREAS, Pete grew up playing drums and creating music in the Mission District, and for over four decades playing at the Mission Cultural Center for Latino Arts (MCCLA) since its founding in 1977 and has maintained his deep ties to the Center to this day; and

WHEREAS, He turned 90 years old this year, inspiring MCCLA to honor his lifelong career and connection to the Mission and MCCLA, with a beautiful, multidisciplinary exhibit of his music, art and memorabilia spanning his storied career; and

WHEREAS, MCCLA is hosting a closing celebration of the Pete Escovedo exhibit on August 2, 2025, to honor the work of this magnificent Bay Area musician and visual artist; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors designates August 2, 2025, as Pete Escovedo Day in the City and County of San Francisco.
