[Muni Heritage Month - September 2025]

Resolution declaring September 2025 as Muni Heritage Month in the City and County of San Francisco in recognition of the San Francisco Municipal Railway's enduring legacy, cultural significance, and historical contributions to the city's identity and transportation.

WHEREAS, For its 113 years of operation, the San Francisco Municipal Railway (Muni) has provided equitable transportation to generations of San Francisco residents, cementing itself in the historical and cultural identity of the city; and

WHEREAS, On September 1, 1917, Muni launched its first bus route, pioneering motor coach service in San Francisco as the first publicly owned and operated transit system in a major American city; and

WHEREAS, Muni has long been a national leader in transit innovation, becoming one of the first major American systems to operate a fleet of zero-emission trolley buses, an early adopter of accessible transportation, and a system known for incorporating public art and design into the commuting experience; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) and its workforce continue to deliver safe, sustainable, and accessible transit service, advancing equity and climate goals while honoring the deep heritage of Muni's past; and

WHEREAS, Muni has long played a critical role in advancing civil rights and inclusion, from hiring women operators during World War II to adopting LGBTQ+ inclusive workplace policies and supporting fare equity programs; and

WHEREAS, SFMTA and the Market Street Railway's historic preservation efforts, such as the operation of restored streetcars on the F Market & Wharves line and the maintenance

of the National Historic Landmark cable car system, serve as living reminders of the city's transportation legacy; and

WHEREAS, On the weekend of September 21-22, 2025, the Market Street Railway, in close collaboration with the SFMTA, will be hosting its yearly Muni Heritage Weekend in celebration of San Francisco's historic and colorful streetcar, bus, and cable car fleets; and

WHEREAS, Honoring Muni's heritage is a recognition of the generations of operators, mechanics, engineers, station agents, cleaners, dispatchers, policy advocates, and community members who have shaped and sustained public transit in San Francisco for more than a century; and

WHEREAS, Recognizing September as Muni Heritage Month honors the contributions of the SFMTA and the Market Street Railway in preserving Muni's rich history and expresses appreciation for over a century of dedicated public transportation service in San Francisco; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco declares the month of September 2025 as Muni Heritage Month to celebrate the San Francisco Municipal Railway's historic role in shaping the city's character, connecting its communities, and advancing public service through transportation; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors affirms the importance of preserving San Francisco's transit history and honoring Muni's long history of contributions to the city's development and identity.
