[Celebrating the 150th Anniversary of Lotta's Fountain]

Resolution celebrating the 150th anniversary of the presentation of Lotta's Fountain to the City and County of San Francisco.

WHEREAS, Lotta's Fountain was gifted to the City and County of San Francisco by the legendary performer Lotta Crabtree on September 9, 1875; and

WHEREAS, Lotta's Fountain is a twenty-four foot tall cast iron, bronze ornate fountain located at the intersection of Market, Kearny, and Geary Streets; and

WHEREAS, Lotta Crabtree, also known as "Lotta" or "Miss Lotta," was one of the most well-known young "Fairy Stars" in San Francisco throughout the 1850's and 1860's as she kept the city entertained through her singing, dancing, and acting at various San Francisco theatres; and

WHEREAS, Lotta frequently performed at benefits for San Francisco volunteer fire companies and always held San Francisco close to her heart as she toured around the country; and

WHEREAS, Lotta commissioned this fountain to provide free drinking water to the public as an expression of her gratitude to San Francisco for recognizing her talents early on and this gift was a great public benefit for 19th century San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, Every April 18th at 5:12 am, firefighters, police officers, and dozens of ordinary San Franciscans participate in a memorial ceremony at Lotta's Fountain to remember the victims of the 1906 earthquake and recognize the importance that the fountain played in the aftermath of that tragedy as a central meeting point for San Franciscans seeking refuge from the city's ruins; and

WHEREAS, Lotta's Fountain was the site of the famous 1910 Christmas Eve performance by opera singer Luisa Tetrazzini, who drew a crowd of 250,000 to the fountain for that performance; and

WHEREAS, Lotta's Fountain was listed in the National Register of Historic Places in 1975; and

WHEREAS, Lotta's Fountain was the first piece of art in the San Francisco Civic Art Collection; and

WHEREAS, In a 2023 survey conducted by the San Francisco Monuments and Memorials Advisory Committee, Lotta's Fountain was found to be the most liked monument or memorial in the Civic Art Collection; and

WHEREAS, Lotta's Fountain is now the oldest surviving memorial in San Francisco; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco hereby recognizes the 150th anniversary of the presentation of Lotta's Fountain to the City and County of San Francisco on September 9, 2025; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco celebrates the unique value that Lotta's Fountain holds as a historical treasure, a work of art, a cultural symbol, and the site of a cherished and long-standing tradition honoring the resilience of San Francisco.
