WHEREAS, Program funding allocations are subject to the terms and conditions of the Requests for Applications, the Application, Program Funding Agreement, and all other legal requirements of the Program; and

WHEREAS, DHCS requires that the governing body of the applicant jurisdiction formally pre-authorize the City to (1) submit applications for Grant funds; (2) accept Grant funds if the City's Grant Applications are approved, with the understanding that all Grant funds must be used for the allowable expenditures and activities identified in the Grant Agreement, and (3) agree to all Grant terms, including binding arbitration and/or a waiver of claims against DHCS and its third-party Grant Administrator; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Department of Public Health ("SFDPH") is hereby authorized to submit the Applications to DHCS for Program funds in an amount anticipated to exceed \$25,000,000; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors acknowledges and agrees that SFDPH shall be subject to the terms and conditions specified in the Program Funding Agreement, and that any and all activities, expenditures, information, and timelines represented in the Applications are enforceable through the Program Funding Agreement; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That if one or more Applications are approved, SFDPH shall obtain authorization by resolution of the Board of Supervisors to accept and expend the grant(s) and enter into the Program Funding Agreements for the total award amount, subject to all Program Funding Agreement terms, including binding arbitration and/or a waiver of claims against DHCS and its third-party Grant Administrator.
