WHEREAS, Supervisor Joel Engardio has proudly served the residents of District 4 and the City and County of San Francisco as a Member of the San Francisco Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, Prior to his career in public service, Supervisor Engardio worked for over 20 years as a journalist to advocate for people who don't feel heard; and

WHEREAS, Supervisor Engardio made history in 2022 when he became the first openly gay supervisor elected on San Francisco's westside; and

WHEREAS, Supervisor Engardio was committed to a future that allows seniors, young adults, and middle-income families to remain rooted in San Francisco, while welcoming newcomers who bring talent, new ideas, and diversity to the City; and

WHEREAS, Supervisor Engardio championed new housing as an equity and environmental issue; and

WHEREAS, Supervisor Engardio passed legislation to allow homeowners to build and sell in-law units, giving long-time homeowners the opportunity age-in-place, downsize their home, and create family wealth; and

WHEREAS, Supervisor Engardio was committed to advancing policies that supported sensible housing solutions and passed legislation to allow for taller apartment buildings with ground floor amenities, like a neighborhood-serving grocery, child care center, or café, so extended families can stay in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, Supervisor Engardio believed all San Franciscans should be invested in local public schools because the city's future depends on keeping families here; and

WHEREAS, Supervisor Engardio worked with parent advocates and sponsored Prop G, which was approved by over 80% of San Francisco voters, which urged the San Francisco Unified School District to offer Algebra 1 to students by the eighth grade; and

WHEREAS, Supervisor Engardio was committed to ensuring San Francisco's small businesses had the opportunity to launch and thrive; he supported and passed legislation that waived fees for new businesses, streamlined permitting for awnings, and make outdoor dining a permanent program in San Francisco's post-pandemic economic rebound; and

WHEREAS, Supervisor Engardio helped secure a million-dollar economic lifeline to local merchants during the construction of L-Taraval train construction and streetscape project; and

WHEREAS, Supervisor Engardio spearheaded the launch of the Sunset Night Market with community partners, attracting tens of thousands of residents and visitors to support District 4's local businesses; and

WHEREAS, The resounding success of the Sunset Night Market inspired the launch of night markets throughout San Francisco, allowing all neighborhoods to celebrate their communities; and

WHEREAS, Supervisor Engardio championed public safety policies and believed in the importance to humanize San Francisco's uniformed police officers by sharing their personal stories through his monthly newsletter; and

WHEREAS, Every year, Supervisor Engardio sat down and met with every officer at Taraval police station and visited the Sunset's firehouses to hear first responders top concerns, issues, and needs; and

WHEREAS, Supervisor Engardio aspired to help all Sunset residents access public safety resources through the creation of a civilian public safety liaison fluent in English, Cantonese, and Mandarin; and

WHEREAS, Supervisor Engardio successfully led efforts to bring community ambassadors and retired police officers to the Sunset's commercial corridors; and

WHEREAS, Supervisor Engardio was devoted to improving the Sunset Boulevard greenway, securing millions to hire additional gardeners and invest in new irrigation infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, Supervisor Engardio leveraged his journalism background in elected office to produce a monthly newsletter with narrative-driven content for over 35,000 recipients, highlighting the District's unique personal stories, community events, and accomplishments; and

WHEREAS, Supervisor Engardio believed in the importance of highlighting how San Francisco's city government was responsive to regular citizenry through the creation of his monthly "Fix It" file; and

WHEREAS, Supervisor Engardio was dedicated to informing and engaging San Franciscans to be active participants in shaping the City's future through his running "SF Politics 101" series; and

WHEREAS, Supervisor Engardio was committed to thoughtful collaboration and engagement with all of his colleagues, especially on issues that divided the Board of Supervisors and the public, including the Gaza ceasefire Resolution, defense of San Francisco's sanctuary city policy, the release of the Banko Brown video, and support for hardworking partners and people in Labor; now, therefore, be it
